**SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM**  
for  
**CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT**  
at Eastern Kentucky University

**Purpose**

This scholarship recognizes the excellence and dedication of students enrolled in the Construction Management Program in the Department of Applied Engineering and Technology. It is named in honor of Dr. Richard A. Brooker, who in 1977, along with the AGC of Kentucky, helped to establish the Bachelor of Science degree program initially titled Construction Technology.

**Qualifications**

To be considered for the scholarship, all applicants must:

- Be enrolled as a full-time student in the Construction Management Program at Eastern Kentucky University.
- Must be within three or four semesters of completion of the Construction Management Degree at the time of the Award.
- Have both an Overall and ECU GPA of 3.00 or above.

**Method of Selection**

The recipient(s) will be selected on a competitive basis by a committee, to be chaired by the Coordinator of the CM program. The committee will consist of the CM faculty, the President of AGC of KY, and the Executive V.P. of AGC of KY. The committee will work in cooperation with the University's Scholarship Office and the Office of Student Financial Assistance in selecting the scholarship recipient(s). Final authority to award scholarships will rest with the University's Scholarship Office.

**Conditions of Scholarship**

The scholarship recipient must maintain a 3.00 GPA and make normal progress toward the degree in CM. Normal progress is defined as successful completion of 30 semester credit hours or more per year. A student who fails to make normal progress toward the degree or does not maintain satisfactory academic standards may be dropped from the scholarship program, but may re-apply when deficiencies are corrected.

**Application for a Construction Management Scholarship**

All applicants must:

- Complete an application form and submit a letter of application outlining any qualifications (honors, service, work experience, etc.) that the applicant would like to be considered by the evaluation committee.
- Submit official transcripts of all college work.
- Write a 250-word essay stating why the applicant is pursuing a career in Construction Management.
